## History of the Bailey Theatre

Legend has it that Camille David headed out from Winnipeg with a herd of cattle looking for a place to build a ranch. He found that place in the Rosalind area Southeast of Camrose, and after making some money as a rancher, he came to Camrose and built the David Theatre in 1908. In 1912 David sold the theatre to Stan Bailey who kept the David Theatre name until June of 1920. It was at this time that Bailey built on the front 40-feet of the theatre, essentially the lobby area, and added the 120-seat balcony. The theatre kept running until movies became the mainstay in the mid-1990s when a multiplex theatre opened and the Bailey could no longer compete. In 1996, Landmark Cinemas donated the building and one of the two projectors to the Bailey Theatre Society.

## The Benefits of the Bailey Theatre

For generations the Bailey Theatre has been a venue for vaudeville, silent movies, "talkies" and untold numbers of musical, social and cultural events. Restoration of this 100 year-old Vaudeville theatre will preserve the history of the oldest performing arts theatre in Alberta. It will provide a venue, once again, for intimate performances in gracious surroundings for Camrose and area residents. The restored theatre will become a tourist destination which will have a major economic impact on the area. The Bailey Theatre will also provide community groups with more options for performing arts and community hall space. The Bailey Theatre, when completed, will seat about 400 people concert style or about 200 in a dinner theatre format. Potential uses of the facility may include a working, interactive art/history museum, theatre camps, live entertainment, recitals, foreign/independent film festivals, comedy festivals, fundraising events, dinner theatre, meetings and receptions.
